John Muir is a Paideia School.

So what is Paideia? Through Paideia learning strategies, students are challenged to analyze, to question, and to think critically. Cultural awareness is stressed through an expanded social science program that includes communication and collaboration with students in other classes. School-wide programs address the skills and knowledge needed to understand worldwide traditions.

Through Paideia seminars, students venture more deeply into areas of study. They draw connections between subjects. Then they construct meaning in a personalized manner.

Seminars are actually done in three steps. Seminars begin with pre-seminar activities. Students review the selected seminar text for a few days before the seminar. They set their own goals for the seminar. The seminar itself begins with identification of main ideas from the text, then moves to focus or analysis of textual details, and closes with personalization and application of ideas from the text.

The school-wide Paideia topic for October is friendship and relationships. Ask your student about what happened during their seminar experience on Friday, October 11th.

For a personal experience and deeper explanation of the Paideia philosophy, all parents are encouraged to come to Paideia and Pizza night on December 4th.

JMAKE brings art into the classrooms.

The mission of JMAKE is to immerse students in art, as it is an integral part of education. We believe ART should enhance learning by making connections between their world and the world of others. We will provide every student with fun and inviting experiences for becoming life-long learners.
